The 4th Annual Frost Place Chapbook Contest Sponsored by Bull City Press Final Judge: Afaa Michael Weaver

The chapbook contest is a collaborative effort between The Frost Place, a nonprofit center for poetry and the arts at Robert Frost's former homestead in Franconia, NH and Bull City Press, publisher of Inch magazine and fine poetry books. The winner receives a \$250 cash prize, 10 copies of a 200 print run of the selected chapbook, a full fellowship to attend The Frost Place Poetry Seminar valued at \$1,500, a featured reading at the Seminar, and the option to live and write for one week in The Frost Place house in September during peak fall foliage, at a time agreed upon by the fellow

and The Frost Place.

The 2016 Dartmouth Poet in Residence at The Frost Place

Since 1977 The Frost Place has housed a resident poet during the summer months at Robert Frost's former home in Franconia, NH. A prize of \$2,000, a six-to-eight week residency at Robert Frost's former home in Franconia, New Hampshire, and featured readings at Dartmouth College and at The Frost Place, is given annually to a poet who has published at least one poetry collection. The aim of this program is to select a poet who is at an artistic and personal crossroads, comparable to that faced by Robert Frost when he moved to Franconia in 1915, when he was not yet known to a broad public.

Submission Period For Both: October 1, 2015 – January 1, 2016. Submissions Fee: \$28.00. Submissions are only accepted online through the online submission manager.
